## **Jumping Program**

Squad members who have nominated for: Jumping, Combined Training or Eventing are required to attend these sessions. Times for sessions will be provided once squad applications have closed and final numbers are determined.

Session 1 - Theory	Saturday 5 March	TBC	NTIES	<ul> <li>How to analyse the course plan, walk the course and develop a riding strategy:</li> <li>Analysing a show jumping course plan and learning how to interpret the information including Article number, speed, time allowed and jump off course.</li> <li>Discussion on how to learn the course and what information you need to gather when walking the course.</li> <li>Identify correct lines, number of strides and how the horse is likely to respond to elements within the course so that they have a very specific plan when riding it.</li> <li>Discuss how to utilise the 45 seconds most effectively, prior to going through the start flags.</li> <li>Learning to split the course into 3 sections as the horse will travel differently in the first third to the last third and this will influence what we need to do to ride a given number of strides in a related line or combination.</li> <li>How to choose the best options for their horse.</li> </ul>
Session 2	Sunday 9 April	TBC	NTIES	<ul> <li>How to ride the course and produce consistent take off distances for a clear round:</li> <li>Identify a 325 m/min speed to ensure that riders are going to come in within the time allowed.</li> <li>Tempo V's stride length</li> <li>Riding consistent take off distances.</li> <li>How to ride a given number of strides in a related line</li> <li>Riding combinations and identifying factors that will make the combination ride short or long.</li> </ul>

				<ul> <li>Identifying each horse's individual stride length</li> <li>How to walk a 'true' distance and then convert it into their horse's stride length.</li> <li>What options are viable and what's not</li> </ul>
Session 3 - Ridden	Saturday 29 May	ТВС	NTIES	<ul> <li>How to ride the Jump Off and Speed classes:</li> <li>Learn how to identify the short track to cut off distance</li> <li>Where are the long stretches and how are you going to travel the distance quickly?</li> <li>Analyse the biomechanics involved in increasing speed.</li> <li>How does speed effect the take-off distance and the jumping effort?</li> <li>How does speed effect the horses' responses?</li> <li>How to set the horse up for a balanced, tight turn to cut off distance.</li> <li>What are the common errors and why horses take rails?</li> </ul>
