Note: Riders who are 12 years old as at 1 January will be considered as a Secondary rider even if still attending primary school.

**These classes may change depending on the host states ability to run the class*

Qualification and Selection?

As per the Northern Territory Interschool Selection Policy, riders must first qualify to be eligible for selection on the NT Team. The policy sets out the minimum requirements to be achieved to qualify for selection.

Riders can qualify and be selected in more than one sport (discipline) however a rider is not permitted to ride more than 1 horse per class e.g., 90cm Jumping or Novice Dressage. A rider cannot compete in more than 2 classes, even if they are riding more than 1 horse i.e., a rider could only do 90cm and 1m jumping or novice dressage and 90cm jumping etc.

It should be noted that as the program for each National Championship can be different, the exact scheduling of the various events may not be known until after entries close. In this case, some riders may not be able to compete in all classes entered.

Final selection will be made in accordance with the policy and is at the sole discretion of the Equestrian NT Board. The policy can be located on the web: www.nt.equestrian.org.au

Riders must be a current Equestrian NT member (any level of membership) at the time of applying to be a member of the selection squad. Riders must be current Equestrian NT Junior Competitor level members at the time of accepting selection of being an NT Team Member.

In addition, for the rider to accept the selection of being an NT Team Member, the rider must nominate a person responsible for them at the national event who must be over 18 years of age and be a member of Equestrian NT (any category).

Horses

Selection is based on the rider. Due to the recognised financial implications of transporting horses from the Northern Territory, pool horses are usually offered to NT and WA riders. Where the selected rider is unable to take their own horse to the National event, riders will have the option of either:

- a) finding their own suitable horse (eg: borrowing a suitable horse through their own contacts) as endorsed by the Equestrian NT Board; or
- b) the host state will be asked to provide a pool horse.

Whilst the NT team has been provided with a sufficient number of pool horses at each National event so far, this can never be guaranteed. The availability of a pool horse prior to the competition can vary with each horse (this is solely dependent on the availability of the owner and can be determined by how far the horse has to travel etc). Whilst the host state will make every effort to have the pool horse available as early as possible, in some cases the horse may only be available 1 or 2 days prior to the competition.

Horses are required to be EA registered & micro chipped (in accordance with EA Regulations) to compete at the National event.

Cost & Travel Arrangements

All costs are at the rider's own expense. A guide to expected costs is provided below. Whilst some financial assistance may be provided by Equestrian NT, this should not be relied upon.

Utilising a Pool Horse

*This is a **guide** only. Costs based on previous National events, however these can vary greatly:*

Pool Horse	\$ 1,000.00	Includes all tack & feed
Entries (per class)	\$ 230.00	
Compulsory Rider Uniforms	\$ 500.00	Jacket, cap, shirts
Compulsory Horse Uniform	\$ 250.00	Browband, saddle blankets etc
Stabling	\$ 460.00	
Airfares x 2	\$ 3,000.00	

Other costs to consider are accommodation, meals, car hire etc.

Travelling to the Event with your own horse.

Transport	\$ 8,000.00	
Entries (per class)	\$ 230.00	
Compulsory Rider Uniforms	\$ 500.00	Jacket, cap, shirts
Compulsory Horse Uniform	\$ 250.00	Browband, saddle blankets etc
Stabling	\$ 460.00	(does not include bedding which is ~ \$20 per day)
Camping at venue	\$ 220.00	(does not include caravan hire if required)

Other costs to consider are accommodation, meals, horse feed, commercial horse transport if taking own horse.

Competitors must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. The ability for horses to stay at the venue prior to the competition depends on the venue. Competitors will be advised on when they are required to be at the venue, this will generally be a few days prior. A compulsory vet check occurs on entry and must be passed before stabling is made available. All travel & accommodation arrangements are the responsibility of the competitors.
